



In thinking about your current Learner Profile, how do those characteristics connect to the behaviors you just mentioned to prepare learners for their future?




Other Responses

- It connects perfectly with anything they choose in life.-Parent





- If you feel safe and cared for, then the barriers to truly enjoy their education experiences will be removed and learning WILL take place


